The Board of Health for Public Health Sudbury & Districts has an exciting leadership opportunity for an experienced, collaborative and values-driven professional to be its full time Medical Officer of Health/Chief Executive Officer (MOH/CEO).

Reporting to an autonomous Board of Health, the MOH/CEO leads a team of over 250 public health professionals and is responsible for the management and administration of all public health programs and services and for fulfilling provincial statutory duties throughout the districts of Sudbury and Manitoulin.

The Board seeks applicants who have demonstrated superior leadership, planning and interpersonal skills, including excellent judgement and communication, and an ability to adeptly lead through others in complex environments and circumstances. As a successful candidate, you embrace equity, diversity, and inclusion in all aspects of the agency's work, and you are committed to building healthier communities for all. You have strong financial and administrative acuity, ensuring the sound management of the organization, transparency and accountability. You have demonstrated knowledge of current practice in relation to public health scientific, legal and ethical issues and you excel when working in a multi-disciplinary field. You are an effective public spokesperson on matters of public health significance, including in emergency situations.

The MOH/CEO is a vital member of local communities—working collaboratively with local health system partners, the education sector, municipalities, social service agencies, private sector partners, community groups, Indigenous communities, and more—to improve opportunities for health for all. As part of the provincial public health system, the MOH/CEO has strong and effective relationships with colleagues across Ontario's 34 local public health agencies and with provincial counterparts, including the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health and the Ontario Ministry of Health.

Position requirements include a current licence to practice medicine in Ontario and a Fellowship in Public Health and Preventive Medicine from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. A minimum of four years of experience in public health and preventive medicine and a minimum of two years of leadership experience are required. Advanced oral and written proficiency in English is required and proficiency in French is a strong asset.

Note that although this posting is for a full-time permanent position, shorter term contracts may be considered.
