The appointment will be Probationary (tenure-track) at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor, or Associate Professor with tenure. The successful candidate will have knowledge, expertise, and a solid record of research productivity that supports innovation and leadership in nursing and health. Our priority research foci in the School are: digital health; women's health; mental health, mental illness and wellness; violence, gender, inequity and health; and global and Indigenous health; areas that align with the [School's Strategic Plan](#) and the signature areas identified in the [Faculty of Health Sciences Strategic Research Plan](#).
