The ideal candidate will have strong strategic and organizational abilities with excellent interpersonal, communications, financial, and member-service skills. The preferred candidate will have post-secondary graduate business degree, public health administration or human services or a combination of an undergraduate degree with at least 10 years senior management experience and over seven years successful experience in management in a community health or social service setting.
