Occupational Health and Safety (OHS)

The appointment will be for a three-year term position at the Assistant Professor level and salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Candidates will be expected to possess a PhD in a relevant health field and have expertise relevant to one or more of the following areas: Maritime OHS, fishing safety, aquaculture health and safety, or marine shipping. The successful candidate will join existing multidisciplinary research teams in Modules I, M, and/or N of the Ocean Frontier Institute (see <https://oceanfrontierinstitute.com/research>).

The term faculty member will contribute to research design, conduct of the research, co-supervision of students and training of highly qualified personnel, dissemination of research findings, and development of new funding proposals within and beyond OFI and the Division. The faculty position will have a strong research focus with teaching responsibilities to be determined by the host unit for this position in consultation with the successful candidate.
