

## **Tenure-track Faculty Position in the Interdisciplinary School of Health Sciences, Faculty of Health Sciences University of Ottawa**

The Faculty of Health Sciences at the University of Ottawa is accepting applications for one tenure-track faculty position in the Interdisciplinary School of Health Sciences. Applicants with a rigorous and innovative research program in one or more of the following areas of **population health** will be prioritized: **health inequities, social epidemiology, health policy**.

The Interdisciplinary School of Health Sciences (ISHS) provides bilingual, interdisciplinary academic, and research environments. ISHS offers undergraduate and graduate training including the PhD in Population Health program. The Faculty of Health Sciences is comprised of five academic units: Nursing, Nutrition Sciences, Rehabilitation Sciences, Human Kinetics, and the Interdisciplinary School of Health Sciences. The Faculty excels in its research endeavours thanks to the efforts of over 115 researchers working in a variety of disciplines.

The University of Ottawa provides a dynamic and stimulating environment for approximately 40,000 students and 5,500 employees where research and knowledge are fundamental to all aspects of university life. Its geographic location in the national capital, adjacent to a number of national agencies such as Health Canada, the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, the Public Health Agency of Canada, Statistics Canada, and other government agencies, offers multiple opportunities for partnerships, training collaboration, and research.

### **Requirements**

1. PhD in health-related field including (but not limited to) population health, social sciences, public health, public policy or health sciences.
2. Postdoctoral experience in research or university professorial experience preferred.
3. Active research track record or strong potential to develop an active research dossier.
4. Excellence or potential for excellence in teaching and academic teamwork.
5. Bilingualism: Demonstrate active functions of one official language and passive functions in the other. Active French/English bilingualism preferred.

### **Responsibilities**

1. Scholarly activities including a developed or developing program of research.
2. Teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels.
3. Direction of research projects/theses for undergraduate and graduate students.
4. Academic service activities within the School, Faculty, and/or University.

### **Salary**

Salary scale for an assistant professor starts at \$85,280.

### **Benefits package**

The University of Ottawa provides a complete compensation package that includes long-term disability, basic group life insurance, supplementary health insurance, University of Ottawa Pension Plan and optional life insurance as well as reimbursement for relocation expenses.

- Curriculum vitae.
- Letter describing their professional experience, their contribution to research, their experience in university teaching and service.
- A brief teaching statement including teaching philosophy, pedagogical approaches
- Description of current and future research plans.
- Names and contact information of three referees. Referees will not be contacted prior to obtaining permission from the candidate.
